▪ **ETHICAL APPAREL AFRICA**

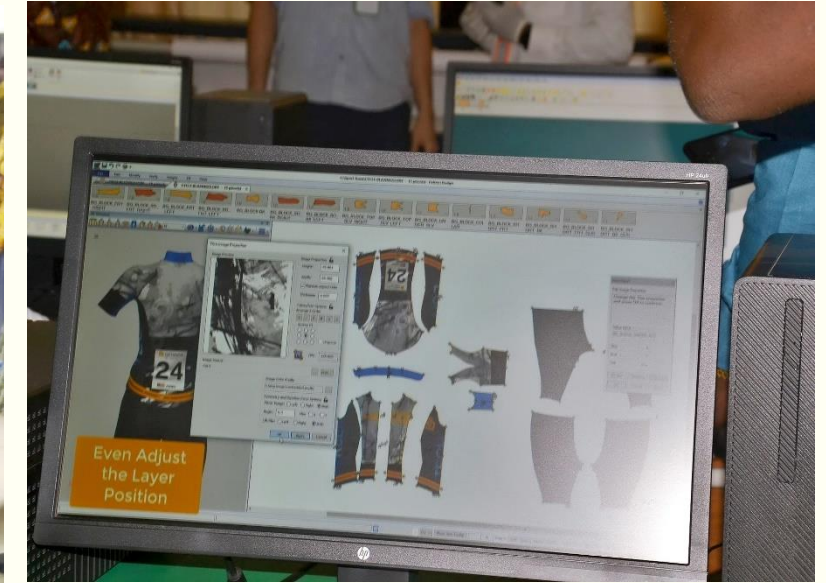

THE ROLE OF PRIVATE STAKEHOLDERS

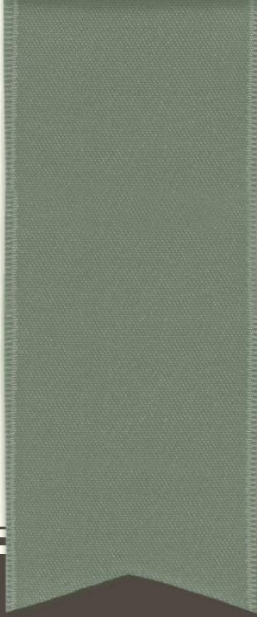
- Engagement with Private stakeholders.
